PROCUREMENT REPORT AND EVALUATION PROTOCOL– CRANE PCP

The procurement

Pre-Commercial Procurement of R&D (Research and Development) Services to develop and ICT enabled comprehensive treatment of chronic patients in rural areas (CRANE).

The procurement was published in TED at the 31st of October 2022 and later at the procurement platform eAvrop. There is a connection between eAvrop and TED. By advertising and changing an advertisement in eAvrop, the corresponding advertisement or change must be made in TED. Since there was a delay between TED publication, 31st of October, and the visibility at the procurement platform eAvrop it was decided to extend the time period of the call for tenders until 6th of November. The extension was made at the 5th of September. Since 6th of November was a Sunday, and it is a common practice to have submission date at a working day, it was decided to have the call open until the 7th of November. This final change of submission deadline was made at the 17th of October 2022.

The Buyers Group

Region Västerbotten, Sweden, is the lead procurer and has been appointed to coordinate and lead the joint CRANE PCP, and to sign and award the Framework Agreement and the specific contracts for all phases of the PCP, in the name and on behalf of the Buyers Group, which also consists of Region Agder, Norway, and Region Extremadura, Spain.

Bodies involved in appraisal and evaluation of the incoming tenders

CRANE appraisal and evaluation bodies has been composed of Regional Advisory Teams, Technical Compliance Expert Team and Value Based Impact experts and the Evaluation Committee.

The Regional Advisory Team consist of staff from the buyer region organisation, who have to certain extent been involved in CRANE and has a good understanding of the CRANE vision and the expected CRANE service solution. The profile of different Regional Advisory Team members is up the regions to choose but there is understanding among the buyer regions that the Regional Advisory Teams are expected to have knowledge connected to the CRANE building blocks: 1. Data management, 2. Trend technologies, 3. Garden of care, and their actors (specifically social services and healthcare services), 4. People matter and 5. Value based impact. Other skills such as project management and expertise from ICT implementation are welcomed.

The Technical Compliance Expert Team was headed by one assigned CRANE expert partner. Each buyer region was asked to nominate one technical expert to form part of the Technical Compliance Expert Team. The final selection of technical experts was made by the Evaluation Committee, all together 4 technical experts were nominated and accepted by the Evaluation Committee. The Evaluation Committee assessed the nominated experts from the criteria of:

- Degree in Computer Science or similar (valuable Master and or PhD);



- 10 years of experience in IT development projects, specially related to data platforms;
- Knowledge in the areas of data architectures and standards, REST, blockchain, SMC, microservices

All buyer regions nominated external Technical Compliance Expert partners, which was endorsed by the Evaluation Committee.

The Value Based Impact Experts were nominated by the buyer regions, and assessed by the Evaluation Committee to have a deep understanding of the values to be generated from especially a citizen's point of view, as well as health and social care professionals' point of view and healthcare and social service organisations point of view. The nominated Value Based Experts are one professor from a Swedish university and one CRANE consortium expert partner. The two nominated Value Based Impact experts were endorsed by the Evaluation Committee. One buyer region did not nominate any Value Based Impact expert. The Evaluation Committee accepted only 2 Value Based Experts.

The Evaluation Committee is the only body that officially assess, evaluate, score the tenders and provide an argumentation of the score. The Evaluation Committee consists of two members from each buyer region. The Evaluation Committee has been chaired by the Lead Procurer – Region Västerbotten.

Evaluation Committee meetings

The Evaluation Committee has met on a weekly basis, during the evaluation process, to discuss the progress of the Regional Advisory Teams, Technical Compliance team and to inform the Value Based Impact experts what tender proposals to appraise from their perspective. The weekly informal Evaluation Committee meetings has taken place online at the 23rd of November, 30th of November, 7th of December, 14th of December and 21st of December 2022.

The final appraisals from Regional Advisory Teams, Technical Compliance Expert team and Value Based Impact experts were shared between the Evaluation Committee members early January 2023.

CRANE Evaluation Committee met up in Brussels at the 11th-13th of January 2023 to make the final assessment/evaluation and to agree on a final selection of proposals to be awarded a contract. Input from Value Based Experts and Technical Compliance Team was considered in the Evaluation Committee final selection.

CRANE Evaluation Committee met online at the 18th of January 2023 to confirm the final Evaluation Committee scoring and the ranking of tender proposals. An award notice was published by Region Västerbotten procurement unit at the 20th of January 2023.

The entire selection process followed the procedure described in "Opening of tenders & evaluation" in TD1. The complete assessment procedure of all incoming tenders was

conducted within the timeframe outlined in the tender documents.

Exclusion criterias, selection criterias, On/off criterias and formal requirements

Hellström Law, the assigned procurement unit by Region Västerbotten, conducted the formal opening as well as an assessment of Exclusion Criteria of all incoming bids. At the same time

as a small team from the lead procurer and an expert partner conducted selection criteria assessment.

The tenders from the following tenderers did not meet the exclusion criteria, selection criteria, On/off criteria and/or the formal requirements, and was therefore not subject to evaluation.

NEXTER srl	According to section 3.3 Selection criteria in TD1 the tenderer must have the ability to perform R&D up to original development of the first products or services. NEXTER srl is not a part of a consortium and it not using any subcontractors. NEXTER srl is a start-up company with less than 10 employees. The submitted CV, the reference projects and the other evidence do not show that the ability to perform R&D up to original development of the first products or services is met.

Please note that this is a pre-commercial procurement that is not covered by the EU procurement directives or Swedish law on public procurement. This means that it is not possible to obtain a Swedish administrative court's review of the decision made by the Buyers Group.

The Buyers Groups observes a voluntary standstill period for 15 days.

The identified typo

The typo refers to the “Evaluation Committee Score” for LCubed AB (iGrant.io). In the report from July 6 2023 LCubed has received a score of 87,0, and a score of 86,4 for the “Price-quality ratio”.

The correct Evaluation Committee score for LCubed AB (iGrant.io) is 88,0. Since this was a typo, the correct score for “Price-quality ratio” is still the same, 86,4.

This has in no way affected the outcome of the evaluation of the tenders and the result of the tenderers that have received the contracts for phase 2 in the PCP. However, the buyers group apologize for the typo in the original report.

Abstract The Brief CRANE has been “developed based on the idea that the use of a broader range of data – including health data but also other personal data – will help manage, reduce the progression, and even prevent chronic conditions...CRANE aims to build the road to provide and facilitate citizens’ actual and ethical control over their own health data and create a proof of concept by integrating data driven services for the self-management of three chronic conditions (COPD, Diabetes, CVDs) in rural areas.” This worthy goal is in line with EU and international initiatives and trends: • The EU sustainable development strategy aims “at the continuous improvement of the quality of life and well-being on our planet for present and future generations”. • The European Health Data Space (EHDS) will empower individuals through better digital access to their personal health data, unleash the data economy for digital health and set up strict rules for the use of individual’s non-identifiable health data for research and other activities. At a global level the World Health Organisation’s 1948 definition of health is being questioned: • “A state of complete physical, mental and social well-being and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity” is recognised to be unachievable. • Huber, Jadad et al. propose an alternative definition: “<i>the ability to adapt and direct control of yourself with regard to the physical, emotional and social challenges of life</i>”. The emphasis here is on resilience and being able to deal with illness and integrate it in life. A focus on what is important to the patient will help bringing the cost down. This future is data-driven, and, to an increasing extent, patient driven. Goals of Project “Antigone¹ – A Reference Architecture and initial services for CRANE” • To achieve greater self-care by allowing individuals to be able to collect, quantify, structure, understand and communicate their health or issue's related to specific parts of their health. • To deliver a standards-based reference architecture for CRANE that delivers immediate benefits while remaining open to future innovation. • To provide the mechanism by which patient- or citizen-centric health, fitness and other data can be collected and shared with full informed consent so that health professionals, researchers and data-driven services can improve the lives through beneficial feedback mechanisms. Project “Antigone” Consortium The consortium consists of 4 companies and is led by Egde: • Egde is a leading Norwegian IT services company with a strong position nationally within e-Health. Egde has developed a gateway for health data sharing with integrations with journal vendors and common public health services and networks. Egde’s expertise in e-health standards combined with the company's interdisciplinary nature means that we can deliver a

Concept

Our aim as a complementary consortium is to provide an engaging, user friendly and motivating platform that allows patients to achieve self-care and empowerment of ownership of their health in collaboration with their healthcare providers.

CRANE emphasises providing the “road” by which data can flow for many stakeholders using the platform. The focus for Egde and Defendable, with technology input from Siemens Healthineers, will be to design and build the platform from established and emerging open-source technologies. It provides data source enablement, data sharing with informed consent and the ability for patients/citizens to easily understand and control the availability and flow of their data.

Project “Antigone” will also integrate two existing products into the platform infrastructure to demonstrate the benefits of the platform and to deliver reference examples for the CRANE challenges of Garden-of-care and Patient self-care.

Security and Privacy by Design

Most importantly, “Antigone” supports the highest levels of security and privacy required for handling and deriving value from sensitive patient data.

Self-care and self-management are a cornerstone in the development of a sustainable healthcare service. With the demographic shift in the 65+ population comes an increase in the number of people with chronic diseases that the current healthcare system is not structured or funded to handle.

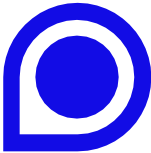
